

Ten Things You Didn't Know About Entomology

Presenter: Dr. Michelle Samuel-Foo



Dr. Michelle Samuel-Foo is the Director of Specialty Crop Research and is currently charged with leading the Alabama State University's research initiative

surrounding Industrial Hemp entomology. Dr. Foo attended the University of Georgia for graduate school where she completed her PhD in Entomology after earning an MS degree in Agronomy. She also holds a B.A. in Biology (Summa Cum Laude) from Brewton Parker College in Mt Vernon, GA. Dr. Samuel-Foo is the current branch president of the South Eastern Branch (SEB) of the Entomological Society of America (ESA). She is also a two-term former president of the International Association of Black Entomologists (IABE). She currently serves as the SEB branch representative to the Diversity and Inclusion National Committee of ESA. In 2020, Michelle was the recipient of the Entomological Society of America's Founders' Memorial Award.

Horticulture CSI: Search for the Long Beach Radish, Growing Potential of Small Gardens Presenter: Dr. Gary Bachman



Dr. Gary Bachman is the Extension/Research Professor of Horticulture at the Coastal Research & Extension Center at Mississippi State University. He hosts the award

winning MSU Extension Service's Southern Gardening TV, radio, newspaper columns, and social media outlets. He is a Fellow, American Society for Horticultural Science, a Great American Gardener, and a member of The American Horticultural Society. Gary and his wife, Katie, live in Ocean Springs, MS. They are urban homesteaders and operate the Heritage Cottage Urban Nano Farm. This farm is a demonstration urban farm to grow and preserve an abundance of locally grown specialty vegetables and produce. Dr. Bachman has BS and MS degrees from Clemson University and a PhD from Ohio State University.
