While all the nominees were stellar on the local level, none had served the AMGA at the state level. The AMGA Board of Directors and the Awards Committee have clarified the requirements for a MG to receive this state award which includes a \$1,500 stipend. Newsletters provide a key strategic tool for Master Gardener associations. Through the written word and pictures, we teach, recall, celebrate, recruit, thank and plan. We hope each association distributes these newsletters to not only Master Gardeners, but key community stakeholders with whom we have relationships and those with whom we'd like to work. Because of our mission, Master Gardeners are the most public facing entity of the Alabama Cooperative Extension System. To support and promote the work of our ACES partner agencies, we are now requiring association newsletters to include a comprehensive calendar of events for the extension office with which it's affiliated. We have also clarified what we need to see in association newsletters that are submitted for awards review. These criteria go into effect immediately and will be used for award submissions next year. GET READY!! Total contributions toward our \$200,000 pledge to Auburn are \$174,300, leaving a balance of \$25,700. If all the stars line up just right and the 2024 AMGA conference was as successful financially as it was in person, with your help we could complete our pledge in 2024! Get out your checkbook. ENDOWMENT FUNDS

The fund activity and balance are only reported by Auburn to us periodically. The last reported balance is December 31, 2023.

The Horticultural Scholarship Fund balance is \$156,828, and the Endowed Graduate Fund balance is \$142,679.

The total anticipated scholarship payout this year (both funds) has not been determined but is expected to be very close to \$10,000. These endowment funds are performing as expected and generating enough income to continue scholarship awards for many years to come. Although these funds have reached their intended goal, they are still open for contributions. What better way to remember an Association president or the passing of a long-time Master Gardener than with a donation to these funds?

AMGA PROJECT FUNDING

The Project Funding Committee had a very successful year with a lot of extra help near the end when applications were slow and then the website quit communicating. Six worthy projects were applied for and approved. These projects and grant amounts are:

- *Wiregrass, \$1,911 for the installation of greenhouses.
- *Limestone, \$1,060 for help with a courtyard at Athens High School to be used to teach the planting and maintenance of the plants to students.
 - *MGNA, \$1,011 for a greenhouse misting system.
 - *Blount, \$1,850 for irrigation installation and community garden expansion.
 - *Calhoun, \$1,353 for improvements to existing greenhouses.
 - *Lawrence, \$1,011 for a Reflective Garden for the Signature School and Community.

All of these special projects had a theme of planting, teaching, and sharing with the community.

We thank each of you for helping bring them to AMGA's attention!

Alabama Master Gardener Association (AMGA) continues to have sound financial standing. Financial documents were included in the 2024 AMGA conference Brochure. Since the Report was submitted for the 2024 Conference, we have had \$14,299.59 income with \$44,258.89 in expenses, leaving a balance of \$118,358.74 reported at the June Board Meeting. Total Reserves \$36,634.36.

Our donations form is available for our membership to begin asking


the community for their help in making the 2025 Conference successful. The conference packet will be sent to possible sponsors. We already have a \$1,000 donation from the Autauga County Commission.


